SPEED LIMIT ORDER 2014

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a 20 miles per hour speed limit on the following lengths of Brunton Lane –
 - (a) between its junctions with Dinnington Road and Wagonway Drive (newly constructed road);
 - (b) between its junctions with Roseden Way and Netherwitton Way; and
 - (c) between its junctions with Brunton Mews and Roseden Way.
3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including a draft Order, map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order) can be viewed free of charge at the following between 8.30 am to 4.30 pm Monday to Friday:-
