

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE**  
**TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009**  
**(EVA STREET AND FARNHAM STREET AREAS, LEMINGTON VARIATION)**  
**ORDER 2017**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Order”). Note – the Council are currently in the process of making a new Consolidation Order (“the new Order”). If the new Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Order.
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to -
  - (1) **introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time restriction** (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road –
    - (a) **Back Ingoe Street (east)** – both sides, from Eva Street northwards for 8 metres;
    - (b) **Back Lesbury Street (east)** – both sides, from Eva Street northwards for 8 metres;
    - (c) **Back Rokeby Street (east)** – both sides, from Farnham Street northwards for 10 metres;
    - (d) **Eva Street** – north side, from 55 metres west of Union Hall Road westwards for 16 metres;
    - (e) **Farnham Street** –
      - (i) both sides, from Rokeby Street eastwards for 9 metres;
      - (ii) north side, from 25 metres east of Rokeby Street eastwards for 15 metres; and
      - (iii) north side, from 60 metres east of Rokeby Street eastwards for 5 metres;
    - (f) **Rokeby Street** – east side, from Farnham Street northwards for 10 metres;
  - (2) **increase the length of existing prohibition of waiting at any time restriction** (double yellow lines) on the north side of Eva Street so that it extends from Union Hall Road westwards for 26 metres (currently extends from Union Hall Road westwards for 14 metres).
3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 Order, may be inspected free of charge at –
