- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order").
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road -

Unnamed Access Road linking Great North Road and St Andrews Cemetery –

- (a) north side, from 150 metres east of Great North Road eastwards for its remaining length including the turning head; and
- (b) south side, from the end of the existing double yellow lines (20 metres east of Great North Road) eastwards for its entire length including the turning head.
