CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE (BOWFELL AVENUE) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2018

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that on 1 February 2018 the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne made an Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 12 February
 2018, is to introduce a prohibition of driving of any vehicle restriction on the following length of road -

Bowfell Avenue – from Scafell Avenue northwards for 16 metres.

Pedal cycles will be exempt from the restriction.

- 3. The Order is required to prevent through traffic and improve road safety.
- 4. A copy of the Order, together with a map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proceeding by way of experiment and of its intention to consider making a permanent Order in like terms may be viewed free of charge at
 - (a) Customer Services, Newcastle Central Library, Charles Avison Building, 33 New Bridge Street West, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8AX between 10.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday, and
 - (b) Newcastle Civic Centre, Barras Bridge, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8QH between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.

- 5. The Order will be in force for a period not exceeding 12 months during which time consideration will be given to making a permanent Order in like terms.
- 6. If you wish to object to the possibility of the Order being made permanent, you should send your objection or representation by **13 August 2018** to Newcastle Parking Services, PO Box 2BL, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE99 2BL, or by email to traffic.notices@newcastle.gov.uk, in either case quoting reference GH/P44/1164. Any objection or representation MUST be made in writing and where an objection is made, it must state the grounds of the objection.
- 7. If it appears essential to the Council that it is necessary in the interests of the expeditious, convenient or safe movement of traffic or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any length of road affected by the Order runs, then a nominated officer of the Council may modify or suspend the Order or any provisions thereof.

8. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within six weeks from 1 February 2018, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
