CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009 (CHERRYWOOD VARIATION) ORDER 2018

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order"). Note the Council are in the process of making a new Consolidation Order ("the new Order"). If the new Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Order.
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a **no waiting at any time** restriction (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of the north-west section of Cherrywood -
 - (i) south west side, from Cherrywood north westwards and south westwards for 50 metres.
 - (ii) south west side, from 56 metres north west of Cherrywood south eastwards and south westwards for 16 metres, and
 - (iii) north east side, from Cherrywood north westwards for 26 metres.
- 3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including the draft Order, map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 Order, may be viewed free of charge at -
 - (a) East End Customer Service and Library, Hadrian Square, Byker, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE6 1AL between 10am and 6pm on Monday, 10am and 2pm on Thursday and 10am and 5pm on Friday (closed Tuesday and Wednesday),

 - (c) Newcastle Civic Centre, Barras Bridge, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8QH between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.
