CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009 (GISHFORD WAY AND BONNINGTON WAY VARIATION) ORDER 2018

- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order"). Note – the Council is in the process of making a new Consolidation Order ("the new Order"). If the new Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Order.
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to -
 - (a) introduce a **prohibition of waiting at any time restriction** (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road
 - (1) **Bonnington Way –** both sides, from Gishford Way south eastwards for 24 metres,
 - (2) Gishford Way –
 - north side, from 6 metres east of Bonnington Way eastwards for 25.3 metres;
 - (ii) south side, from 31.3 metres east of Bonnington Way westwards for 64.3 metres;
 - (b) introduce a **no stopping on school entrance markings restriction** between 8am and 5pm Monday to Friday on the following length of road –
 - (1) **Gishford Way –** north side, from 6 metres east of Bonnington Way westwards for 37 metres.
- 3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 Order, may be inspected free of charge at
