HUNTERS ROAD AND FOUNTAIN ROW

(i) Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Fountain Row Variation) Order 2019

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Consolidation Order”).
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to increase in length the existing no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on part of the north east side of **Fountain Row** so that it extends from Ancrum Street north westwards for 15 metres (currently the double yellow lines extend from 14.5 metres south east of Back Ancrum Street to Ancrum Street).

(ii) (On Street Parking Places) Order 2009 (Hunters Road and Fountain Row Variation) Order 2019

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, 63 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne (On Street Parking Places) Order 2009 (“the 2009 On Street Order”).
2. The effect of the proposed Order is –
 - (a) to reduce in length an existing Permit Parking Place on the north east side of **Fountain Row** so that it extends from 6.5 metres south east of Back Ancrum Street south eastwards for 5.5 metres (currently the parking place extends from 2.5 metres south east of Back Ancrum Street to 2.5 metres north east of Ancrum Street);
 - (b) to reduce in length an existing Permit Parking Place with Parking Meters on the south east side of **Hunters Road** so that it extends from 20 metres north east of Fountain Row north eastwards for 48 metres (currently the parking place extends from 14 metres north east of Fountain Row north eastwards for 58.2 metres).

The Council’s reason for proposing the Orders is to improve road safety.
