HUTTON TERRACE

(i) **Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Hutton Terrace Variation) Order 2019**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the Consolidation Order”). Note – the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order. If the new Consolidation Order is made before the proposed Order, then the proposed Order will become an amendment to the new Consolidation Order.

2. The effect of the proposed Order is -

- (a) to introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following length of road –

Hutton Terrace – north side, from the unnamed access road between 9 Hutton Terrace and 19 to 27 Middleton Court westwards for 7 metres;

- (b) to formalise the existing no waiting at any time restrictions on the following lengths of **Hutton Terrace** –

- (i) south side, from Portland Terrace eastwards for 14 metres;

- (ii) south side, from 4.5 metres west of Back Portland Terrace (east) eastwards for 8.5 metres;

- (iii) south side, from 3 metres west of Back Hutton Terrace eastwards for 8.5 metres

- (c) to re-describe some of the existing lengths of no waiting at any time restrictions on **Hutton Terrace** so that the descriptions in the Consolidation Order accurately reflect the situation on the ground. No physical changes will be required;

- (d) to re-describe an existing length of no waiting 8am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday waiting restriction on **Hutton Terrace** so that the description in the Consolidation Order accurately reflect the situation on the ground. No physical changes will be required.

(ii) **(On Street Parking Places) Order 2009 (Hutton Terrace Variation) Order 2019**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, 63 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne (On Street Parking Places) Order 2009 (“the On Street Order”). Note – the Council are considering making a new On

Street Order. If the new On Street Order is made before the proposed Order, then the proposed Order will become an amendment to the new On Street Order.

2. The effect of the proposed Order is -

- (a) to introduce a parking place with limited waiting except of permit holders on the following length of road. The hours of operation will be 8am to 6.30pm Monday to Saturday. Waiting will be limited to 2 hours with no return for 6 hours. Holders of parking permits for the J9 parking zone will be exempt from the time limit –

Hutton Terrace – north side, from 17 metres east of Portland Terrace eastwards for 28 metres.

- (b) to re-describe existing lengths of limited waiting/permit parking place on the south side of **Hutton Terrace** so that the descriptions in the 2009 On Street Order accurately reflect the situation on the ground. No physical changes will be required.
