

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009
(MAIN ROAD, DINNINGTON VARIATION) ORDER 2019**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Order”). Note – the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order (“the new Consolidation Order”). If the new Consolidation Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Consolidation Order.

2. The effect of the proposed Order is to **introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines)** on the following length of road –

Main Road, Dinnington – east side, from 41 metres south east of Brenkley Close south eastwards for 20 metres.

3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 Order, may be inspected free of charge at –
