

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009
(POTTERY LANE VARIATION) ORDER 2019**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Order”). Note – the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order (“the new Consolidation Order”). If the new Consolidation Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Consolidation Order.
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to -
 - (a) **introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines)** on the south side of **Pottery Lane** from Forth Banks westwards for 95 metres;
 - (b) **revoke** (remove) the provisions in the 2009 Order for no waiting between 8am and 6.30pm Monday to Saturday on the south side of **Pottery Lane** from Forth Banks westwards for 33 metres, and no waiting at any time on the south side of **Pottery Lane** from 65 metres west of Forth Banks westwards for 32 metres.
3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 Order, may be inspected free of charge at –
 - (a) Customer Services, Central Library, Charles Avison Building, 33 New Bridge Street West, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8AX between 10.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday;
 - (b) Newcastle Civic Centre, Barras Bridge, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8QH between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.
