## CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009 (BAXTER AVENUE AND HOYLE AVENUE VARIATION) ORDER 2019

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order"). Note the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order ("the new Consolidation Order"). If the new Consolidation Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Consolidation Order.
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road
  - (a) Baxter Avenue -
    - (i) west side, from 20 metres north of the southern end of Baxter Avenue southwards then eastwards for 26 metres;
    - (ii) east side, from 54 metres north of the southern end of Baxter Avenue south eastwards to its junction with Hoyle Avenue;

## (b) **Hoyle Avenue** –

- (i) east side, from the southern end of Hoyle Avenue northwards for 6 metres:
- (ii) west side, from 55 metres north of the southern end of Hoyle Avenue south westwards to its junction with Baxter Avenue.
