PITT STREET

(i) (On Street Parking Places) No. 7 (Diana Street Area) Order 2009 (Pitt Street Variation) Order 2019

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, 63 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne (On Street Parking Places) No. 7 (Diana Street Area) Order 2009 (“the 2009 On Street Order”).
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to reduce a length of existing permit holders parking place on the north side of Pitt Street so that it extends as follows -

Pitt Street – north side, from 23.1 metres west of Spring Garden Lane westwards for 16.3 metres (currently extends from 12.8 metres west of Spring Garden Lane westwards for 27 metres).

(ii) Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Pitt Street Variation) Order 2019

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Consolidation Order”).
2. The effect of the proposed Order is to increase a length of existing no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the north side of Pitt Street so that it extends as follows -

Pitt Street – north side, from 77.4 metres west of Wellington Street westwards for 32.8 metres (currently extends from 77.4 metres west of Wellington Street westwards for 22.5 metres).

The proposals are in connection with a footway extension on Pitt Street outside the Earl of Pitt Street pub.
