## CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009 [2017] (NETHERBY DRIVE AND KIRKHEATON PLACE VARIATION) ORDER 2017

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order"). Note the Council is currently in the process of making a new 2017 Consolidation Order ("the 2017 Order"). If the 2017 Order is made before the proposed Order, then the proposed Order will become an amendment to the 2017 Order.
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a **prohibition of waiting at any time restriction** (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road
  - (a) **Netherby Drive –** south side, from 14 metres west of Kirkheaton Place eastwards for 29 metres:
  - (b) **Kirkheaton Place –** both sides, from Netherby Drive southwards for 15 metres.
- 3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order), and the 2009 [2017] Order, may be inspected free of charge at

  - (c) Newcastle Civic Centre, Barras Bridge, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8QH between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.
