

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009
(WALKER ROAD/BRAMPTON AVENUE VARIATION) ORDER 2019**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the Consolidation Order”). (Note – the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order (“the new Order”). If the new Order is made before the proposed Variation Order, then the proposed Variation Order will become an amendment to the new Order).
2. The effect of the proposed Order is -
 - (a) to increase in length an existing no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the north side of Walker Road so that it extends as follows –
 - (i) **Walker Road** – north side, from 36 metres east of Pottery Bank to its junction with Brampton Avenue (currently extends from 36 metres east of Pottery Bank eastwards for 76 metres);
 - (b) to introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following the length of road –
 - (i) **Brampton Avenue** – west side, from Walker Road northwards for 13 metres;
3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order (including draft Order, map and a statement of the Council’s reasons for proposing to make the Order), and a copy of the Consolidation Order are available for inspection at -
 - (a) the East End Customer Service Centre and Library, Hadrian Square, Byker, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE6 1AL between 10am and 6pm on Monday, 10am and 2pm on Thursday and 10am and 5pm on Friday (closed on Tuesday and Wednesday),
 - (b) Customer Services, Central Library, Charles Avison Building, 33 New Bridge Street West, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8AX between 10.00 am and 4.30 pm Monday to Friday, and
 - (c) Newcastle Civic Centre, Barras Bridge, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 8QH between 9.00 am and 4.30 pm Monday to Friday.
