

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
TRAFFIC REGULATION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2009
(SKINNERBURN ROAD AREA VARIATION) ORDER 2020**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (“the 2009 Consolidation Order”).
2. **The effect of the proposed Order is to -**
 - (a) introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road –
 - (1) **Dunn Street** – both sides, from Skinnerburn Road northwards for 27.7 metres,
 - (2) **Monarch Road** - east side, from Skinnerburn Road/Water Street southwards for 17 metres,
 - (3) **Skinnerburn Road** – both sides, from Water Street/Monarch Road eastwards for 38.8 metres,
 - (4) **Water Street** – east side, from Skinnerburn Road/Monarch Road northwards for 22.6 metres;
 - (b) introduce a no waiting 8am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday restriction (single yellow line) on the following length of road -

Skinnerburn Road – both sides, from 38.8 metres east of Water Street/Monarch Road to 161 metres west of Shot Factory Lane.
