- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the 2009 Order").
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on the following lengths of road
 - (a) Bells Close -
 - (i) south side, from 80 metres east of Scotswood Road eastwards for 57 metres:
 - (ii) south side, from 181 metres east of Scotswood Road eastwards for 32 metres (including turning area); and
 - (iii) north side, from 80 metres east of Scotswood Road eastwards for 132 metres;

(b) Mercia Way -

- (1) western leg
 - (i) both sides, from Bells Close northwards for 15 metres; and
 - (ii) east side, from 42 metres north of Bells Close northwards for 22 metres;

(2) eastern leg –

- (i) both sides, from Bells Close northwards for 15 metres; and
- (ii) west side, from 43 metres north of Bells Close northwards for 8 metres.
