

**CITY OF NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE
(ON STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2009
(MORPETH STREET VARIATION) ORDER 2021**

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 32, 35, 45, 46, 49, 53, 63 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne (On Street Parking Places) Order 2009 (“the On Street Order”). Note – the Council are considering making a new On Street Order. If the new On Street Order is made before the proposed Order, then the proposed Order will become an amendment to the new On Street Order.

2. The effect of the proposed Order is -
 - (a) to designate the following length of road as a parking place for loading/unloading by any vehicle. The parking place will be in operation all days and all times –

Morpeth Street – south side, from 10 metres north west of Cross Morpeth Street north westwards for 12 metres.

 - (b) to accommodate the above parking place it is proposed to reduce in length an existing parking place for permit holders on Morpeth Street. The new length of permit parking place will be as follows –

Morpeth Street – south side, from 22 metres north west of Cross Morpeth Street north westwards for 37.5 metres (currently extends from 10 metres north west of Cross Morpeth Street north westwards for 49.5 metres).
