## WHICKHAM VIEW AREA

- (i) Proposed Pedestrian Crossing Whickham View
- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne, in exercise of its powers under Section 23(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police proposes to establish a pedestrian crossing at the following location –

## **Puffin Crossing**

Whickham View – 14.8 metres south east of its junction with Broadmead Way

(Length of Restricted Area along the carriageway to be 61.4 metres and width to be full width of the carriageway).

The crossing is necessary to facilitate pedestrians crossing Whickham View.

- (ii) Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 (Broadmead Way and Ferguson's Lane Variation) Order 2021
- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the City of Newcastle upon Tyne propose to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 29 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which amends the City of Newcastle upon Tyne Traffic Regulation (Consolidation) Order 2009 ("the Consolidation Order"). Note the Council are considering making a new Consolidation Order. If the new Consolidation Order is made before the proposed Order, then the proposed Order will become an amendment to the new Consolidation Order.
- 2. The effect of the proposed Order is to -
  - (a) introduce a no waiting at any time restriction (double yellow lines) on -
    - **Ferguson's Lane** both sides, from Whickham View north eastwards for 22.2 metres
  - (b) amend within the Consolidation Order the description of the no waiting at any time restriction on the north side of **Broadmead Way** so that it reflects the restriction extending from Whickham View south westwards for 25 metres (currently described as extending from Whickham View southwards for 41 metres).
