








Which council areas are covered?



7 local councils are included:

- 1. County Durham
- 2. Gateshead
- 3. Newcastle
- 4. Northumberland
- 5. North Tyneside
- 6. South Tyneside
- 7. Sunderland.



These councils will stay the same and do the same work they do now.

3 organisations would stop working, these are:

- 1. the North of Tyne Combined Authority (NTCA)
- 2. the North-East Combined Authority (NECA)
- 3. the Joint Transport Committee.



These jobs would be done by the new Authority.

There would be a new Authority called the North-East Mayoral Combined Authority (NEMCA).

This would be run by a new Mayor with the leaders of the councils.



Local people in the North-East could vote for who is the new Mayor in 2024.



There would also be a group that checks the decisions being made and that money is being spent properly.














What happens next?


